I always install one with any tankless heater as cheap insurance against such a problem. As far as adding something to clean the lines I would refer to the manufacturers instructions and use only what they recommend in order to preserve your warranty. Turn it on, put the cup, press Start button and thats all, in some seconds the exact amount of water is in the cup at the right temperature.
